Buckets should be returned to the church by Sunday, March 17th.


Sunday Small Group Study

United Methodist General Conference Coming Soon!

Elected delegates from all over the world will be gathering from April 23 to May 6 in Charlotte, NC. The General Conference is the main legislative decision-making body for the United Methodist Church. This is the first General Conference that has been able to come together since 2019 and the first to meet since a large number of congregations made the decision to leave the denomination. The United Methodist Church is structured very similar to the United

States government with legislative, judicial and executive branches. The General Conference compares to the US Congress. There is a Judicial Council that is similar to the Supreme Court. The executive branch is made up of the Council of Bishops. Also similar to the United States Government, it's complicated.

Palm Sunday Celebration


Join us on Sunday, March 24th at 12 noon in the Fellowship Hall for a Palm Sunday Celebration! All are welcome!

Join us for food, fun and fellowship! Please bring a side dish or dessert to share and the church will provide the main dish.


Sunday Worship In-Person & Online


