










Let's Celebrate Black History Month Together!



Join us this February as we celebrate Black History Month, a time to reflect on the rich history and achievements of African Americans. This week, we are highlighting an Emory & Henry alumnus - Arthur Theron "Scrapper" Broady. Broady's journey from the hills of Marion, Virginia continued as he was one of the first Black students and the first African American football player at Emory & Henry. After graduating in 1970, "Scrapper" was drafted into the United States Air Force and received many honorable awards and medals. Broady's story is a reminder that dreams, even the biggest ones, can begin on a small college campus. He is also

remembered by many for his personal motto: "Whatever I do, I want to make a difference."

Volunteer Musicians Needed
