


#### Heat is Back On at the Church!

**Communion Sunday** 

It is a tradition at State Street to support food pantries and other emergency service programs on Communion Sundays. All of our local pantries have shared that the number of people seeking food assistance has been rapidly increasing. As you grocery shop this week, pick up a few extra things and bring them to the church this Sunday. They will be delivered to the Emergency Food Pantry. Here are some helpful tips:

- Everyone donates Kraft Mac and Cheese in the box. They can rarely use it because it needs milk and butter which is hard to get from regular food banks.
- Boxed milk is a treasure, as kids need it for cereal which they also get a lot of.
- Everyone donates pasta sauce and spaghetti noodles.
- They cannot eat all the awesome canned veggies and soup unless you put a can opener in too or buy pop tops.
- Tea bags and coffee make them feel like you care.
- Sugar and flour are treats.
- They fawn over fresh produce donated by farmers and grocery stores.
- They rarely get fresh meat.
- Tuna and crackers make a good lunch.
- · Hamburger Helper goes nowhere without ground beef.
- They get lots of peanut butter and jelly but usually not sandwich bread.
- Butter or margarine is nice too.
- Eggs are a real commodity.
- Cake mix and frosting makes it possible to make a child's birthday cake.
